

A Catalog of the Cone Snail Specimens (Neogastropoda: Conidae) Deposited in the Natural History Museum of the National Science Museum, Thailand

Abstract

A catalog of the cone snail specimens housed in the Natural History Museum of the Thailand National Science Museum (THNHM) is presented. A total of 310 specimens of 61 species in two genera are deposited in THNHM. Most of the specimens were collected from Thailand especially from the east and the south of the country since 1962. The specimens donated by Mr. Aphipong Chainam, former Thai ambassador to the United States, were also included in the catalog.

Introduction

The Natural History Museum of the National Science Museum in Thailand (THNHM) was established in 1995, belonging to the Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research and Innovation. The museum maintains a large collection of plant, bird, amphibian, reptile, mammal, animal horn, antler, insect, and invertebrate specimens, and it is one of the most important collections in Southeast Asia. The curators of the museum have started cataloging the type and non-type materials in the THNHM to improve the knowledge about the collections and provide information to the taxonomic community (Chan-ard and Makchai, 2011; Jeenthong *et al.*, 2013; Jaitrong *et al.*, 2021; Piraonapicha *et al.*, 2021; Jeenthong *et al.*, 2021; Jiaranaisakul and Wonglersak, 2021; Pratumthong *et al.*, 2021; Pratumthong and Khlaipet, 2024).

Conidae, with the current common name of "cone snails", is a family (previously subfamily) of predatory sea snails, marine gastropod mollusks in the superfamily Conoidea. The family contains over 800 recognized species, varying widely in size from lengths of 1.3–21.6 cm (Abbott, 1974) with the most abundance in the Pacific Ocean. About 300 species are known from Thailand (Walls, 1978). The snails within this family are sophisticated predatory animals (Schroeder and Craik, 2012). They hunt and immobilize prey using a modified radular tooth along with a venom gland containing neurotoxins; the tooth is launched out of the snail's mouth in a harpoon-like action. All cone snails are venomous and capable of "stinging" humans, live ones should be handled with great care.

A large set of specimens of the cone snail family Conidae was collected since 1962 and are now housed in THNHM. In the present paper, a checklist of the snails is provided to the taxonomic community.

Materials and Methods

The specimens of Conidae deposited in the Natural History Museum of the National Science Museum in Thailand (THNHM, Figure 1) were examined. The specimen localities were corrected if they were originally misspelled. The nomenclature was determined following Abbott and Dance (1990); Habe (1964); and the website World Register on Marine Species (2024).

The list of the specimens is arranged alphabetically by genus and species, following the format:

Specific name, author, publication date

Material examined. REGION: Number of specimen (THNHM code), locality, collection date (months in Roman numerals), collector (leg.), field number (if available).

Distribution. Province of Thailand.

References. If available.

Results and Discussion

A total of 310 specimens in 61 species belonging to two genera (*Conus* Linnaeus, 1758 and *Conasprella* Thiele, 1929) are deposited in THNHM. All specimens belong to the genus *Conus*, except one specimen which belongs to the genus *Conasprella* (Table 1). Among the specimens deposited in THNHM, 53 species were collected from Thailand and eight species from other countries. In Thailand, about 300 species have been recorded. Thus, to date, the number of species known in the collection accounts for 17.67% of the Thai species.

Conus betulinus Linnaeus, 1758 has the highest number of specimens comprising 11.61% of all species, followed by Conus ebraeus Linnaeus, 1758 (8.70%), Conus miliaris Linnaeus, 1758 (7.41%), Conus textile Linnaeus, 1758 (7.41%), and Conus literatus Linnaeus, 1758 (4.51%), respectively. A species in the genus Conasprella aculeiformis (Reeve, 1844) is a rare cone shell that has only one specimen deposited in the collection.

Most specimens in THNHM were donated by Mr. Aphipong Chainam, former Thai ambassador to the United States Thailand since 1962. A set of specimens has no other collection data, only Thailand is listed for each specimen's locality data. However, these specimens are important. Thus, the specimens are included in the catalog.




Figure 2. Conasprella aculeiformis (Reeve, 1844).




Figure 3. A, Conus achatinus Gmelin, 1791; B, Conus amadis Gmelin, 1791; C, Conus ammiralis Linnaeus, 1758; D, Conus araneosus nicobaricus Hwass, 1792; E, Conus arenatus Hwass, 1792; F, Conus argillaceus Perry, 1811; G, Conus artoptus Sowerby, 1833; H, Conus australis Holten, 1802; I, Conus betulinus Linnaeus, 1758; J, Conus capitaneus Linnaeus, 1758; K, Conus caracteristicus Fischer von Waldheim, 1807; L, Conus catus Hwass, 1792.




Figure 4. A, Conus chaldaeus (Röding, 1798); B, Conus cinereus Hwass, 1792; C, Conus cocceus Reeve, 1844; D – Conus conspersus Reeve, 1844; E, Conus coronatus Gmelin, 1791; F, Conus distans Hwass, 1792; G, Conus ebraeus Linnaeus, 1758; H, Conus eburneus Hwass, 1792; I, Conus exiguus Lamarck, 1810; J, Conus figulinus Linnaeus, 1758; K, Conus flavidus Lamarck, 1810; L, Conus fulgetrum Sowerby, 1834.




Figure 5. A, Conus generalis Linnaeus, 1767; B, Conus geographus Linnaeus, 1758; C, Conus glaucus Linnaeus, 1758; D, Conus gloriamaris Chemnitz, 1777; E, Conus imperialis Linnaeus, 1758; F, Conus jickelii Weinkauff, 1873; G, Conus leopardus (Röding, 1798); H, Conus litteratus Linnaeus, 1758; I, Conus lividus Hwass, 1792; J, Conus magus Linnaeus, 1758; K, Conus miles Linnaeus, 1758; L, Conus miliaris Hwass, 1792.




Figure 6. A, Conus milneedwardsi Jousseaume, 1894; B, Conus monile Hwass, 1792; C, Conus muriculatus Sowerby, 1833; D, Conus natalis Sowerby, 1858; E, Conus nigropunctatus Sowerby, 1858; F, Conus nussatella Linnaeus, 1758; G, Conus ochroleucus Gmelin, 1791; H, Conus radiatus Gmelin, 1791; I, Conus quercinus [Lightfoot], 1786; J, Conus retifer Menke, 1829; K, Conus sponsalis Hwass, 1792; L, Conus stercusmuscarum Linnaeus, 1758.




Figure 7. A, Conus striatus Linnaeus, 1758; B, Conus sulcatus Hwass, 1792; C, Conus suratensis Hwass, 1792; D, Conus telatus Reeve, 1848; E, Conus tenuistriatus Sowerby, 1858; F, Conus tessulatus Born, 1778; G, Conus textile Linnaeus, 1758; H, Conus thalassiarchus Sowerby, 1834; I, Conus tulipa Linnaeus, 1758; J, Conus urashimanus Kuroda & Ko. Itô, 1961; K, Conus vexillum Gmelin, 1791; L, Conus virgo Linnaeus, 1758.
